## National Animal Shelter Appreciation Week, November 3-9

Every year, the first full week of November is set aside as National Animal Shelter Appreciation Week as a way to honor animal shelters and the dedicated people who work to protect animals. The City of Chico Animal Services would like to take this opportunity to encourage our community to become more acquainted with the services provided by the City run animal shelter.

The original portion of the City of Chico Animal Shelter was built by the City in 1956, with an addition built in 1987, and a new kennel building completed in 2013. The facility has 71 dog runs, 7 small dog cages, 62 cat cages and 5 medical cages.

The shelter is run by 6 full time City staff members with the assistance of 4 interns and a variety of volunteers, including local residents, ROP and Chico State students and community service workers. Volunteers logged over 36,000 hours of donated time for the 2012-2013 fiscal year.

City Staff and volunteers are responsible for the feeding and care of all animals housed on the City property, including the dogs in the new kennel building waiting for adoption. Additional duties include reuniting lost pets with their families, providing resources for people who have found or can no longer keep a pet, and finding homes for animals that are not claimed by their owners. City of Chico shelter staff adopted out 63 dogs, 211 cats, and 26 "other" animals, mostly rabbits, this past year.

In addition, shelter staff cares for sick and injured animals, works with rescue groups for special needs animals, and cares for orphaned kittens. Staff is proactive in helping people solve their animal problems and works with animals to make them more adoptable.
